### Day Two: Greenest

As President of the United States, I hereby declare that the following standards be met within each industry by 2025:

- A. Large Corporate Businesses
  - a. Must source at least 50% of its energy from renewables other than biomass; this includes transportation
  - b. Must recycle as many materials as possible
  - c. Cannot send any of their waste into nearby ecosystems before finding a way to treat it themselves and prevent any environmental contamination
- B. Restaurants
  - a. Cannot serve drinks with plastic straws - must provide reusable, compostable, or edible options
  - b. Must use recyclable plastic containers for any take out food
  - c. Cannot use plastic bags for takeout food
  - d. Must reduce food waste as much as possible
- C. Convenience and Clothing Stores
  - a. Reduce the amount of lighting by 20% and use LED bulbs
  - b. Groceries must be kept on the shelves until the sell by date
  - c. Paper bags should be the default, and every non-reusable bag will be a \$.05 charge
- D. Agriculture
  - a. The number of cattle will be reduced by 33% and meat products will incur price raises to make this food a luxury and not a daily requirement - subsidies will be given to make up for any loss in the farm's revenue
  - b. Cover crops must be used before every winter, crops must be properly rotated, and soil must be tilled only when absolutely necessary
  - c. Gleaning programs will be implemented for every farm, either on a job or volunteer basis
- E. Energy Companies
  - a. Fracking, mountaintop removal, and tar sand methods are prohibited
  - b. All energy investments here on out must be towards renewables or research on renewables
  - c. 25% of the budget on energy will be placed towards liquid fluoride thorium reactors
