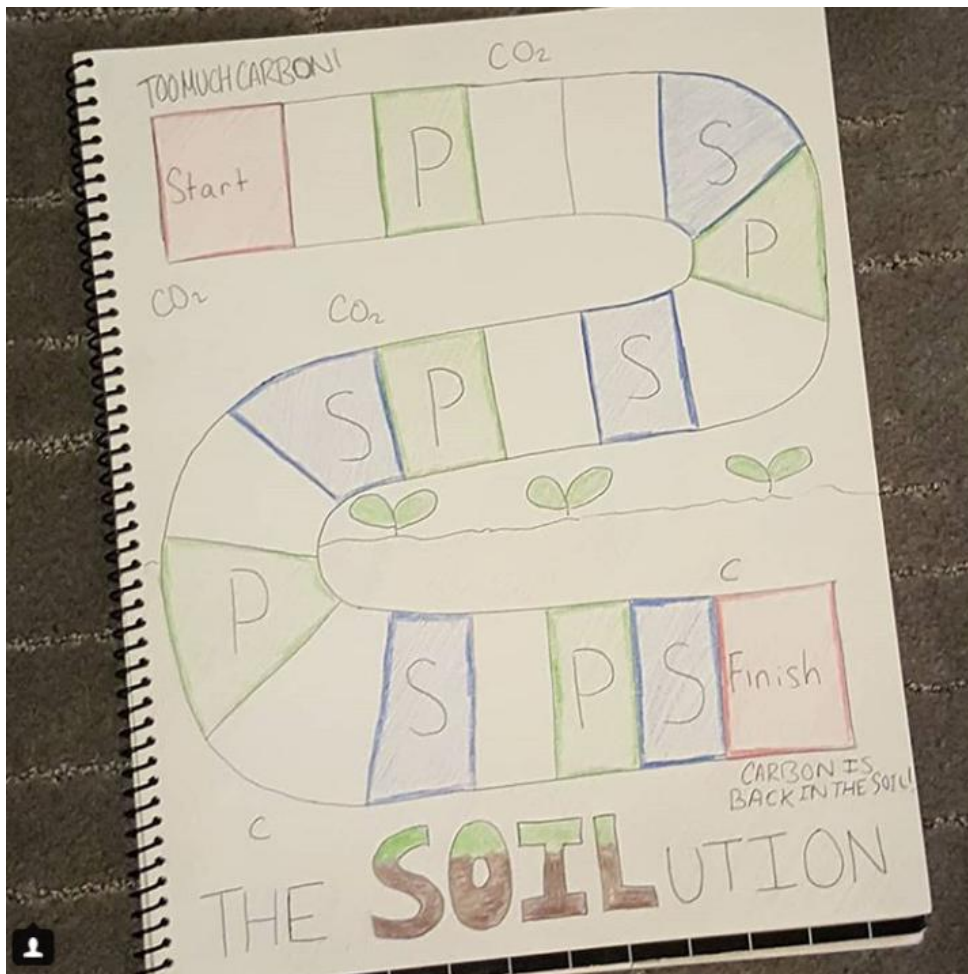
REFLECTION
